Moxie is five young Irish musicians who are inspiring audiences, and the music establishment, with their new palette of 21st century Irish music. 'Count yourself among the fortunate. You are about to hear something new, something fresh, something daring' says Paul F Wells, Director at The Center for Popular Music at Middle Tennessee State University. The award-winning quartet from Galway combines Irish old-time bluegrass music and song to reveal the banjo's rich legacy and roots. Featuring banjo, fiddle, mandolin, guitar, vocals and percussion We Banjo 3 make an extraordinary musical statement. This band of brothers, Enda and Fergal Scahill and Martin and David Howley are among the most celebrated and distinguished young musicians in Ireland today.

The Irish Times describes them as 'absolutely virtuosic' and LiveIreland are calling them 'a new force in Irish music'. On their debut CD UkFolkMusic.co.uk said '[it] will hopefully one day be considered on a par (in folk music terms) with say the first time you heard Steeleye Span or Fairport Convention.' WeBanjo3 have been at the forefront of Irish banjo and fiddle for two decades. Their competitive success is unrivalled, Martin holding seven All Ireland titles, Enda with four, while Fergal and David hold All Ireland titles on banjo, fiddle, bodhran and guitar.

Enda has recorded and performed with The Chieftains, Frankie Gavin, Stockton's Wing, Grammy-winner Ricky Skaggs and The Brock McGuireBand. Fergal has performed with David Munnelly, Martin O'Connor and Kevin Crawford and has toured the world with Ragus and Celtic Legends and Martin was the very first Irish banjo player to perfom at the Grand Ol Opry in Nashville. Support at this concert is from Maz O'Connor, a gifted singer of traditional and self-penned songs. In 2013 she was nominated for the BBC Folk Awards Horizon Award and selected for a creative fellowship with the English Folk Dance and Song Society at London's Cecil Sharp House, funded by the BBC Performing Arts Fund. She sings both traditional folk songs and her own compositions.




Fig. 1. a large fish with legs in a room.




Fig. 2. a man with a birdcage head, unable to eat insects with a knife and fork-(no hope)

Kellie Strøm was born in Copenhagen, raised in Ireland and now lives and works as an illustrator in London. In addition to newspaper, magazine and comic book illustration, Strøm has also worked within film and theatre design.

His most recent illustration creation is a 'Leporello' (concertina book) commissioned and published by NoBrow books entitled 'Worse Things Happen at Sea'. During this talk Strøm will explain the process used to create the illustrations for this book. Strøm creates intricate colour separations which overprint to give the illusion of many more colours than are actually used in the printing method. He will also outline the development of his technique from his early days of newspaper illustration in Dublin and Copenhagen.

Liverpool Irish Festival is over the moon to present the English première of Five Fables, one of Seamus Heaney's final works before his death in 2013. 'Five Fables' consists of five beautifully animated tales, translated by the Nobel laureate from medieval fables.

Narrated by Billy Connolly with an especially composed score by Barry Douglas the tales have been stunningly rendered in enchanting 2D animation by Northern Irish animation studio Flickerpix. 'Five Fables' was broadcast on BBC Northern Ireland for the first time this spring. It will be screened at Picturehouse at FACT as part of our family-friendly programme.

David Cumming, Exec Producer Flickerpix, said: "What has made this project so exciting is the bringing together of so many talented people from different disciplines – all at the top of their game. Seamus Heaney's wonderful translation, Billy Connolly's rich delivery, Barry Douglas's beautiful music, Joel Simon and Dean Burke's stunning images."

Barry Douglas said about composing and performing Five Fables: "I've written cadenzas for Mozart and Beethoven piano concertos, but this is a very major thing for me, a new departure and I'm very excited."





He was called to the Bar of Northern Ireland in 1986 and later to the Bar of Ireland. Between 1989 and 1991 he was Reid Professor of Criminal Law in Trinity College Dublin. He took silk in 2001. In the last ten years his practice has been mainly in Constitutional and Administrative Law and Human Rights. Following the transfer of policing and criminal justice powers to Northern Ireland he was appointed Attorney General for Northern Ireland on 24 May 2010. He is the first person to hold the office separately since its functions were assumed by the Attorney General for England and Wales in 1972.




